You can choose to work in either watercolour or gouache; I chose to paint using watercolour and to have a professional Botanical Artist as a tutor who is an expert in both mediums, I feel is very rare and extremely helpful to you as a student.

Each project has an instructive title, project deadline date, an introductory explanation of the aims of the project and suggested instructions on how to prepare, manage and to bring your project to conclusion.

The six projects are invaluable in developing key drawing and painting techniques, you are directed, taught, shown and encouraged by Simon to progress your artistic ambitions towards achieving standards of artistic excellence.

Simon has meetings with you during each project's time frame, so you can discuss in detail the different botanical and natural history topics you wish to study and to share ideas about. Within these meetings Simon uses Photoshop as a teaching tool to show you visually how to evolve your sketches, studies and final paintings, this helps immensely with your learning.

At the end of each project you are given a report about your work and each report is absolutely fantastic, the amount of detail and insight given into your art work, is really phenomenal and these reports become an invaluable resource of support, encouragement and inspiration.

Receiving personalised online consultation sessions, being shown and encouraged to enjoy and have fun in your painting along with timely prompts to ensure that you are continuing to maintain good art practices is truly fantastic.
